

COLLECTION DEVELOPMENT CRITERIA

Subject Area: Kinesiology and Health
Academic Year: 2009-2010
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PURPOSE:

The purpose of this document is to assist in selecting and maintaining a well-balanced, quality collection that will support educational and research needs of kinesiology and health students and faculty.

GENERAL CRITERIA:

LANGUAGE: English is the desired primary language. Works originally written in languages other than English will be purchased selectively and usually in English version.

GEOGRAPHICAL: Primary emphasis is on kinesiology and health literature in the United States, and secondary emphasis on kinesiology and health literature from Canada, Latin American, Europe and Asia.

DATE OF PUBLICATIONS: Literature published in the 20th and 21st Century is most desirable. Older works may be added to the collection only when the piece of literature reflects historical development of an area of kinesiology and health or the literature is needed for a specific teaching or research endeavor.

TYPES OF MATERIALS: Works dealing with specific sports or activities taught by the department, materials appropriate for male and female students, and materials pertaining to the instruction of kinesiology at the elementary and secondary levels.

FORMAT OF MATERIALS: No specified format is required as long as it meets the kinesiology and health collection development criteria.

OTHER CONSIDERATIONS: Because kinesiology and health students and faculty often must draw upon a wide variety of interdisciplinary resources, the purchase of materials in subjects not mentioned above will be considered when a rationale is provided and after it is recommended by faculty.
